Overview of the Program

- The Summer Nutrition Program reimburses meal sponsors for serving free, healthy meals to children and teens ages 18 and younger in low-income areas during the summer.
- Meals can be served at a variety of types of locations and generally need to be eaten onsite in a group setting, which is referred to as congregate feeding. The requirement to serve meals in a congregate setting can create barriers to participation, especially in rural communities.
- The Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2023 established a permanent Non-Congregate Meals (NCM) service option that allows summer meals to be eaten off-site in certain rural areas, including "rural pockets", which are areas within counties not designated as rural but that were approved by USDA to serve NCM due to need and access limitations.
- USDA updated the definition of "rural" in a memo issued January 19, 2024; see the full definition of rural at www.fns.usda.gov/sfsp/rural-designation. To learn if a summer meal site fits into the revised rural classification, please visit www.fns.usda.gov/sfsp/rural-designation.
- During the summer of 2023, the NC Department of Public Instruction developed a process for approving school districts to serve NCM at eligible sites.

8 school district sponsors operated NCM sites.

NCM sites served meals between 4 and 39 days with an average of 27 days.


