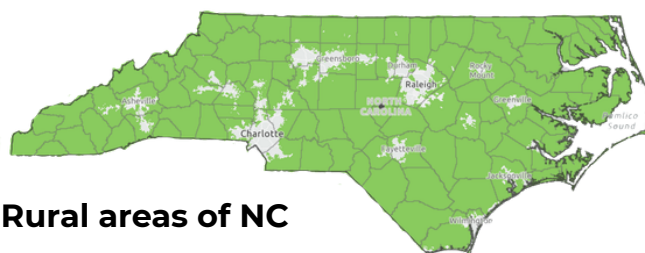


Non-congregate meals (NCM), in rural areas, picked up or delivered to homes

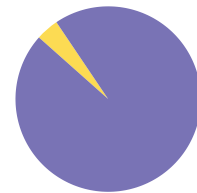
